

Information I Want People to Know About My Thesis/Dissertation/Doctoral Paper

It is important that you at least consider the following pieces of information before you begin submitting your thesis/dissertation to IUPUIScholarWorks because:

1. It will help others, including potential employers find your thesis on the World Wide Web
2. IUPUIScholarWorks times out after about 5 minutes of inactivity. If you pause longer than a few minutes the system will logout and force you to start over from the beginning unless you have clicked the Save button.

Do you want to upload 1 PDF of your entire thesis/dissertation or would you prefer to break your thesis down into smaller files, by chapters for example? For most a single PDF will suffice. Some students prefer to break their thesis into smaller files for ease of formatting and PDF conversion. Others like to break it up because their thesis is so long that a single PDF takes a very long time to download. The decision is completely up to the student.

Do you want to assign a Creative Commons License which will specifically state how others can and cannot use your work? You can skip the Creative Commons license option all together if you'd like. Think about the following options and select only one option below.

- ☐ **No Creative Commons License.** – You still hold the copyright, but you let others decide how it is appropriate to use your work.

- ☐ **Attribution (CC-BY).** You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your copyrighted work — and derivative works based upon it — but only if they give credit the way you request.

- ☐ **Noncommercial (CC-BY-NC).** You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your work — and derivative works based upon it — but for noncommercial purposes only.

- ☐ **No Derivative Works (CC-BY-ND).** You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform only verbatim copies of your work, not derivative works based upon it, for both non-commercial and commercial use.

Allow modifications of your work - NO

- ☐ **Share Alike (CC-BY-SA).** You allow others to distribute derivative works only under a license identical to the license that governs your work.

Allow commercial uses of your work - YES

Allow modifications of your work – Yes, but only if they SHAREALIKE

- ☐ **Noncommercial - Share Alike (CC-BY-NC-SA).** You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your work — and derivative works based upon it — but for noncommercial purposes only, as long as they do so under a license identical to the license that governs your work.

Allow commercial uses of your work - NO

Allow modifications of your work – Yes, but only if they SHAREALIKE

- ☐ **Noncommercial – No Derivative Works (CC-BY-NC-ND).** You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform only verbatim copies of your work, not derivative works based upon it, and only non-commercially.

- ☐ **CC0.** You waive all rights to your work and it will be placed in the public domain. **You will no longer hold the copyright.**
