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INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND

Section II: Social Workers includes a summary all licensed social workers actively practicing in Indiana, stratified by license type.

Section III: Marriage & Family Therapists includes a summary of all licensed marriage & family therapists actively practicing in Indiana, stratified by license type.

Section IV: Mental Health Counselors includes a summary of all licensed mental health counselors actively practicing in Indiana, stratified by license type.




Figure 1.1 Distribution of Addiction Counselor Licenses in Reporting Sample




Figure 2.1 Distribution of Social Worker Licenses in Reporting




Figure 3.1 Distribution of Marriage & Family Therapist Licenses in Reporting




Figure 4.1 Distribution of Marriage & Family Therapist Licenses in Reporting
