Promoting Inclusion in Indiana through Modifications to Health Workforce Data Collection Efforts

Background

Supplemental information has been captured from licensed Indiana health care professionals during the biennial license renewal process for over a decade. The process for collecting this supplemental information was recently codified through enactment of Senate Enrolled Act 223-2018. The Governor's Health Workforce Council serves as the review and approval body for supplemental information fields that are captured.

In compliance with this law, to reduce administrative burden on the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency and support inter-profession comparison, data collection efforts for affected professions have been standardized to the extent possible given variations between health care profession types. In 2019, the Council approved the development of an Indiana Minimum Data Set (MDS) Tool for licensed health professionals.² Many question fields were structured based on a federal MDS survey tool for physicians that was developed by the Federation for State Medical Boards.³ The MDS survey tools support consistency in core data elements across states (federal MDS) and between professions (Indiana MDS).⁴

Current State of Health Workforce Demographic Data Collection

To support multi-profession comparison, Indiana reviewed and adopted many of the demographic question styles available on the federal physician MDS or the U.S. Census. Below is a comparison of the federal physician MDS, U.S. 2020 Census, and the Indiana MDS.

Recommendation for Future Health Workforce Demographic Data Collection

In order to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion, the following recommendations have been made to Indiana's Minimum Data Set demographic questions, spearheaded by the Indiana Behavioral Health Workforce Data Advisory Group:

- Sex
 - Female
 - o Male

NOTE: Response options for this question have been alphabetized.

- What is your race? Mark one or more boxes.
 - American Indian or Alaska Native
 - Asian
 - o Black or African American
 - Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander
 - o White
 - Some Other Race

NOTE: Response options for this question have been alphabetized.

- Are you of Hispanic, Latina/o, or Spanish origin?
 - Yes
 - o No

NOTE: Language for this question has been modified to include both gender forms of LatinX and revised to include Spanish origin.

Considerations for Implementation

Given that demographic questions have been standardized across Indiana health professions licensure surveys, all affected data fields should be modified concurrently to preserve inter-profession comparability to the extent possible after considering administrative feasibility of this coding change.

Approval by Indiana Governor's Health Workforce Council

In their June 17th, 2021 meeting, the Governor's Health Workforce Council voted to adopt the demographic questions as written above to be included in all health professions license renewal information fields. This change was made to the Indiana Minimum Data Set and will be included across all health professions that receive supplemental questions during license renewal.
