THREAT ANALYSIS

123 residents were evacuated from a nursing home in Bryn Mawr, PA on Monday because of major water leak through the roof, which also caused a small electrical fire at approximately 2:00 a.m. A combination of ambulances and buses were utilized to transport the residents to a number of local facilities, including three hospitals. Of particular note was the deployment of a terrorism task force mobile hospital tent to the nursing home. Patients were being moved from the building and into the tent by 6:00 a.m.



ACTION STEPS

Did you know that we have a mobile care facility in Marion County?

- [1] Discuss with your staff that one of the assets MESH has available for deployment is the Multi-Agency Support Tactical Facility (MASTF). This facility consists of three 19' by 35' structures, and one 20' by 20' structure. The facility can be deployed in its entirety, or each structure can be deployed independently. Each structure is self-contained with generator-supplied power and a heating and cooling unit.
- [2] Encourage staff to see the MASTF. One 19'x35' structure will be deployed to various hospitals during the summer months in order to familiarize staff with the facility. Deployment dates will be included in this brief.
- [3] Visit the MASTF now. The entire facility is currently deployed at IEMS/MESH, 3930 Georgetown Road, as a part of EMS week. Please email Jim Floyd at jfloyd@meshcoalition.org to tour the facility.
