**THREAT ANALYSIS**

- [1] The emergency department of Saint Louis University, MO hospital was closed for several hours and went on EMS diversion, after a patient presented with injuries to his hands and fireworks explosives were found in his vehicle in the parking lot.
- [2] Florida Hospital Kissimmee was briefly locked down and went on EMS diversion when an in-patient informed hospital staff that his girlfriend had threatened to come to the hospital and shoot him.
- [3] Our colleagues at Community North Hospital probably never expected Aretha Franklin to seek treatment at the Emergency Department, but she did so recently when she fractured a toe: the result of an unfortunate interaction with her Jimmy Choo shoes.

**ACTION STEP**

***Routine services can be impacted at any moment***

- [1] Ensure that policies, plans and procedures for dealing with a variety of situations are in place and practiced by staff. For example, do you have a VIP plan in place? How would you handle a sudden visit by a celebrity?
