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2022 INDIANA BEHAVIORAL HEALTH WORKFORCE BRIEF

Indiana is fortunate to have a robust mechanism to identify, quantify, and describe the behavioral health workforce throughout the state. The behavioral health professions included in this brief are licensed by their respective boards (see figure on right), each of which resides under the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency (PLA). For the past few decades, Indiana behavioral health professionals have provided information on their demographic, education, and practice characteristics through a series of supplemental questions embedded within the license renewal process.

Since 2018, these behavioral health licensees (and other selected health professions) who completed license renewal online have been required to provide key information back to the State to support policy and planning. 1,2 The below diagram demonstrates the total number of professionals per license type. The information in the brief represents the **unique individuals** who report serving Hoosiers and are therefore contributing to Indiana's behavioral health workforce.














What do Indiana Addiction Counselors report as their highest level of education?







Beginning in 2020, only LCAC/As with multiple licenses who reported this as their primary license were included in the reporting sample for clinical addiction counselors. This resulted in the significant decline in practicing clinical addiction counselors in Indiana, as they were primarily working under another behavioral health license.



Who are Indiana Clinical Addiction Counselors by sex?








What are Indiana Clinical Addiction Counselors' top practice settings?




What proportion of Indiana's Clinical Addiction Counselors report providing telehealth services?





The number of active licenses and practicing professionals with an LBSW is low in comparison to the number of individuals who graduate annually with a bachelor of social work (n=705 graduates in 2020). This is likely because many individuals are pursuing master's degrees, but may also be due to other factors, (such as lack of awareness of this new license –enacted in 2017– or lack of employment opportunities for these professionals. There are some licensing exemptions related specifically to BSW's that are working in organizations with DCS contracts, and Employers being unaware of licensing requirements for the BSW.









What do Indiana Social Workers report as their highest level of education?




What proportion of Indiana's Social Workers report providing telehealth services?












What are Indiana Marrriage and Family Therapists' top practice settings?



What proportion of Indiana's Marrriage and Family Therapists report providing telehealth services?






















Capacity and Geographic Distribution

There are several federally funded, State-operated, and externally-housed incentive programs available to support the Indiana behavioral health workforce. Most of these programs incentivize service in rural and underserved areas or specialties in Indiana.

Substance Use Disorder Treatment and Recovery Loan Repayment Program (STAR LRP)

If accepted, the STAR LRP repays eligible educational loans in exhange for full-time service for six years at a STAR LRP-approved treatment facility.

Behavioral or Mental Health Grants

- Substance abuse prevention and treatment services
- Combined primary and behavioral health care services to groups of people in rural or high-need areas.



STATE OPPORTUNITIES:

• The Indiana Department of Health operates <u>Indiana's State Loan Repayment Program</u> which offers up to \$20,000 for a two-year service commitment to serve in certain geographies or settings throughout the state. Upon completion, participants may reapply one additional time, to receive an additional \$20,000 for another two-year commitment, for a total of \$40,000 for four years of service.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH WORKFORCE POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

2022 SENATE ENROLLED ACT 365 - PSYCHOLOGY INTERJURISDICTIONAL COMPACT

What did it do?

• Psychologists from other compact-participating states can practice via telehealth and temporary in-person practice under their home state license. Additionally, Indiana psychologists are offered the same privileges in other compact-participating states.

2023 SENATE ENROLLED ACT 160 - PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS LICENSURE COMPACT.

What does it do?

- Allow professional counselors to practice in Indiana under an out-of-state license if certain criteria are met

2023 SENATE ENROLLED ACT 1 - BEHAVIORAL HEALTH MATTERS.

What does it do?

- FSSA may apply for a Medicaid state plan amendment, a waiver, or an amendment to an existing waiver to:
 - Require reimbursement for eligible certified community behavioral health clinic services
 - Participate in the expansion of a community mental health services demonstration program
- Requires the division of mental health and addiction to establish and maintain a help line to provide confidential emotional support and referrals to certain resources to individuals who call the help line
- Establishes the Indiana behavioral health commission and sets forth the commission's membership.

2023 SENATE ENROLLED ACT 11 - MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPISTS

What does it do?

· Modifies field experience requirements for marriage and family therapist or a therapist associate licenses

2023 SENATE ENROLLED ACT 350 - PROFESSIONAL LICENSING

What does it do?

• Disallows a local unit of government from regulating behavioral health and human services that are licensed or certified or exempted from licensure or certification by the behavioral health and human services licensing board.
